As you know, our primary goal is to provide comprehensive and competitive products and services to you. We are also committed to providing value added services as we become aware of them. Therefore, I would like to inform you of the PACE/PACENET Program which is the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Prescription Assistance Program. This program was designed to assist the older Pennsylvanians in our great state obtain comprehensive and affordable prescription drug coverage. Many of you have expressed concerns over the challenges of saving money and the affordability of health care. This program may offer a solution if you or a loved one is struggling with the cost of prescription medicine. I encourage you to learn more about this important program.

Brief Overview

PACE/PACENET is funded by the Pennsylvania State Lottery and it is open to individuals who show a prior year's income up to \$23,500 if single, and up to \$31,500 for married couples. Assets and resources do not count toward determining eligibility for PACE/PACENET. If you own a home or currently have a prescription drug plan, you may still qualify for PACE/PACENET and benefit from this program.

PACE/PACENET Eligibility Requirements

- You are age 65 or older
- You have been a Pennsylvania resident for 90 consecutive days
- You are not eligible for prescription benefits under Medicaid
- You are below the income limits above
